THE PERSE SCHOOL (SINGAPORE)

The Immersive English-Mandarin bilingual programme at Perse is designed to develop high-level academic proficiency in both English and Mandarin. More than just mastering two languages, we nurture children to be truly bilingual and bicultural students.

Starting August 2025, The Perse School (Singapore) will start an Immersive English-Mandarin bilingual programme for Nursery to Year 2 (ages 3-6), expanding to higher year levels in the coming years, allowing students to continue their studies in the bilingual programme throughout junior school.

Through immersive learning, cross-cultural experiences, and a carefully structured alternating language model, students benefit from a wellrounded education that supports language development, cognitive flexibility, and global competence.



Dual-Language Model (The 50/50 model)


The Two-Way Immersion (TWI) bilingual model integrates students from English and Chinese-speaking backgrounds in a balanced language environment. By learning core subjects in both languages, students develop academic proficiency alongside bilingual and biliterate capabilities.

Academic and Cognitive Benefits

- **Bilingual & Biliterate:** The 50/50 model ensures proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking both languages.
- **Enhanced Cognitive Skills:** Learning a second language enhances problem-solving, memory, and attention.
- **Stronger Academic Performance:** Dual-language learners excel in reading, math, and standardized tests.
- **Stronger Language Skills:** Deepens understanding of both primary and secondary languages.

Bilingual Programme Structure

We are introducing this programme from Nursery onwards, leveraging young children's natural ability to absorb languages during their early years.





Our Approach: Alternating Language Days

Students receive instruction in English one day and Mandarin the next, creating a structured immersion experience.

Equal Exposure: This approach ensures that students are exposed to both languages for an equal amount of time, promoting balanced language development.

Immersive Learning: The alternating days allow for a deeper immersion in each language, as students are constantly using and hearing the target language in various contexts.

Accelerated Language Acquisition: The constant exposure to both languages in a rich environment can accelerate language acquisition, enhancing listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

Cultural Understanding: This approach fostering cultural understanding, empathy, and appreciation for diversity.



Key Observation & Analysis:

- Mandarin and English vocabulary acquisition start gradually (Ages 3-5)
- Rapid Growth Phase (Ages 6-9) "Vocabulary Spurt" , particularly Mandarin
- Continued but slower growth (Ages 10-12), both languages converge, suggesting a strong bilingual proficiency.

FAQs

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Will there be an entry assessment to determine eligibility?

• Our programme caters to both beginner and heritage speakers. An entry assessment may be required for pupils joining the programme in Year 2.

Can EAL pupils be enrolled in the Bilingual programme?

 Yes, students who wish to join the programme must be proficient in at least one of the languages (English/ Chinese). EAL students will be required to take EAL lessons during language acquisition periods.

How will my child's language proficiency be assessed?

• We conduct regular assessments in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, using internationally recognised benchmarks such as YCT.

Will students be penalised for using English on Chinese days?

• No, our approach ensures a positive and immersive experience with gentle reinforcement.

What if my child struggles with Chinese ?

• There will be a Teaching Assistant (TA) in class to support children's learning, ensuring that students receive the help they need to build confidence and improve their Chinese skills.

Are the Chinese teachers native speakers?

• Yes, they are qualified educators, who are native or highly proficient speakers of the language.

Are there options to move back to the 'English stream'?

• Teachers will assess the child's progress and advise parents on the best pathway if they are not thriving in the Bilingual Programme.

Will my child miss learning contents from the 'English Stream?'

• Students will be taught the same curriculum as those in the 'English stream'. The difference is that the Cambridge International Curriculum is delivered in English and Chinese.
